OVERVIEW

International law encompasses a range of issues, such as human rights, disarmament, migration, treatment of prisoners, conduct of war, among others. TRENDING LAW DESTINATIONS

› London, United Kingdom

- One of the most influential legal systems in the world, London offers unique insights into international law. Explore history, constitutional background, interpretations of law, and the English court system where some of the most significant legal decisions have been made.

› Seoul, South Korea

- South Korea is home to one of the world's oldest legal systems, since then, however, laws have been made and revised modeling Anglo-American law systems. The market was recently opened to foreign firms, giving students insight into a market that was required to adapt to a globalized world.

› Dubai, United Arab Emirates

- As the United Arab Emirates expand, Dubai has quickly developed a robust legal and regulatory framework, attracting global businesses and investors. In a rapidly changing world, explore how the UAE created a system that is both culturally representative and open to global firms and ideas.

- › **Buenos Aires, Argentina**
 - Argentina adopted a new civil code in 2015, simultaneously undergoing a political and economic transformation, returning to international capital markets in the process. Given this, Argentina provides a unique growth perspective into international contracts, joint ventures and risk, foreign inversions, guaranties of the state, and conflict resolution.

- › **New York City, New York**
 - The United States has a robust law industry with cumulative revenues around 2 trillion U.S. dollars over the period of 2012 – 2018, with approximately 1 lawyer for every 300 people in the country. To stay competitive, new trends are now driving the industry including electronic discovery, social networking and legal process outsourcing. As a historically top legal market, New York City offers the perfect setting to meet with dominant law firms and explore the trends that are changing the market.
